Bill Marshal Prichard, age 76, of North Tonawanda, entered into rest, Sunday September 16, 2012.

Mr. Prichard was born August 23, 1936 in Louisa Kentucky, son of the late Charles and Alice (nee Salmons) Prichard.

Bill was a graduate of Louisa High School and the Century College of Business, he also attended Marshall College in Huntington, West Virginia.

Mr. Prichard was in the United States Navy from 1954 to 1958, serving 42 of his 48 months at sea aboard the USS Casa Grande.
