I too remember Carolyn from grammar school. The other kids used to mock me cuz my mother sent me to school with my hair not combed and wearing the same dress for three days in a row. Carolyn never mocked me. For some reason she became my friend. We ended up hanging out together at times. I remember the pretty house she lived in on the corner of California street. At that time she only had a younger sister. I don't remember a brother. We used to go roller skating a lot. Then they all got bikes and i couldn't go cuz i didn't have one. I think i was ten at the time being in 4th grade. I only remember two incidents. I guess her mother used to bake hard rolls, and we were in the kitchen one day and Carolyn opened up a big metal can and gave me a hard roll her mother had baked. The other incident i remember is that Carolyn used to hide her little army soldiers or cowboys - can't remember which as i am 70 now - she hid them under the claw bath tub in a paper bag! She had told me she hid them so her little sister wouldn't take them. I also remember in school they both had super long hair almost down to their waist for a long time. Then one day they both got their hair cut at the same time and they came to school with super short hair. They looked like twins. One more thing i remember from school. We used to wear dresses in those days. Carolyn was sorta the teachers pet as she was so smart. One day as i was sitting at my desk i saw Carolyn out in the hall walk by the door and she was holding her dress up just a tiny bit with this real funny smile on her face. I found out later that she had been eating chocolate in the auditorium and it got all over her dress and she was hiding it as she went to the bathroom. One more incident i remember. I moved away and i must have been 12 yrs old and swimming at the pool. Carolyn jumped in the pool, grabbed me by the arms and lifted me up. She was just playing. I was surprised to see her. We exchanged a few words and i never saw her again. About 20 yrs ago i looked up her name in the phone book and i called her. She remembered me. She did tell me she had some heart problems. I think she was living with a friend at the time, but we never went into it. Someone was at the door and so she hung up fast. I never did call her again. I have good memories of Carolyn, and the funniest part was her hiding her little plastic soldiers under the tub in a paper bag. I am not surprised that she became a nurse as she had a high IQ. Rest in peace Carolyn. We all will remember you.
