It was a beautiful blue glass heart that Laure bought over the weekend when she was out with friends on one of her adventures. Laure included a note that said, blue hearts do exist. I still have that blue heart hanging on my wall. Laure was right, the children brought their hearts to school and you could barely tell that they were blue. Except, one family kept the heart blue and wrote: I would be blue without you. Now, all I can think of is how Laure will be missed by so many ... we will be blue without her. 💙
