“ *Paul (and his brothers Phil and Sterl) amazingly preserved the music of their grandfather, Jesse R. Martin, in a way that few other traditional musicians did. My dad heard Martin play in the '20s and '30s and raved about his playing, which we thought in the '60s was long gone. Then in 1973, Sterl played a tape of Paul and Phil (with Bill on guitar) made the previous year at the family reunion, and everyone who heard it was amazed! He was so enthusiastic about playing it that in 1976 he and Sterl left at 3 a.m. to go to Michigan for an Original Dulcimer Players Club meeting! In subsequent years, with the revival of the instrument, he played at all kinds of places and influenced a lot of people. It is wonderful that he continued to play until such a ripe old age. May his memory be blessed.*

Paul cancelled due to heart issues so Ann and I drove up to see him. We hit it off right away, sharing our family heritages, his Grandpa and my Gramma. We talked about the tunes we like and where they came from. We weren't supposed to play very long but it did go into the night. That started a beautiful friendship.
