Bob was employed as a service technician for Hobart ITW for 32 years where he installed and repaired commercial cooking equipment. Around the house, Bob could fix anything.

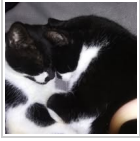
Bob was a member of Kenmore Presbyterian Church for over 50 years and served as an elder and as a trustee. He was an avid reader. In recent years,
